Church-Based

Local churches know their community's needs and are best-positioned to address them. Forgotten Voices partners with trusted and committed churches to serve orphaned and vulnerable children and their caregivers in their communities.



Family-Focused

Children thrive in nurturing families – so we equip families with safe parenting skills training, economic empowerment, emotional support and more. That way, families have skills and resources to meet their family's needs while creating safe and supportive homes for children.



Child-Driven

Every child's needs are different: some need education support, others need grief counseling or even skills training. Whatever the need, we work to co-create custom development plans with our church partners to ensure every child's needs are taken care of.

Together, we have cared for **over 400 orphaned children and vulnerable families** through:

- Education Support (tuition, uniforms, etc.)
- Counseling for Healing from Trauma
- Skills Training
- Parenting Training
- Spiritual Support

The church also has a garden that provides struggling families with food and funds future initiatives to better serve the children and families in their community.

How Caregivers Were Empowered in 2020



1,194 caregivers attended workshops and were equipped with parenting skills, practical tips, counseling assistance, and more



873 caregivers received skills, business, or agriculture training, investments into their small business, seeds for farming or livestock



265 caregivers placed in savings & credit associations to safely save money, invest in local ventures, and receive spiritual support

Meet Katherine in Zambia!



Katherine is a young teacher who has two children of her own and also cares for two other orphaned children. After her husband abandoned the family, Katherine felt overwhelmed and alone trying to provide for the children.

But God is faithful. Through a partnership between Chinkuli Free Methodist and Forgotten Voices, Katherine joined a savings and credit

association(SCA) at the church and began saving a little amount each month.

Together with Forgotten Voices, the church also helped her start a market garden to support her family.

Katherine has become an instrumental member of her community. She volunteers on Chinkuli Free's orphan care committee and tutors young girls. She's also helping train others in the creation of SCAs!

Orphaned and vulnerable children experience significant truama that affects their development and well-being. To best care for these precious children, we need to address their physical, emotional, and spiritual needs.

Well-adjusted children are more likely to succeed in school, develop healthy relationships, and avoid early marriages, early pregnancy, and poverty.

How Children Were Served in 2020



5,418 children learned of God's love, were prayed for, and encouraged in their faith



918 children received counseling and at-home visits to heal from trauma



836 children received assistance with their school fees, uniforms, and school supplies



FINANCIALS



COVID-19 RESPONSE

Just as COVID-19 has affected our daily life here in the US, life in southern Africa has changed dramatically. Businesses failed and schools were shut down. This led to food shortages across the region.

To address these overwhelming challenges, Forgotten Voices and its church partners rolled out custom plans to address food shortages, parenting challenges, and more.



383 households in **Zambia** received food, cleaning supplies, and more



145 households in **Zimbabwe** received food, cleaning supplies, and more



185 households in **Malawi** received food, cleaning supplies, and more

Mapalo and her mom (photo, top right) were in a tough spot when COVID-19 began affecting their day-to-day lives.

Their food stand business was failing and the family was not sure where to turn. They were running out of options to purchase food and needed help.

Thanks to you, the Forgotten Voices led food distribution was an answer to Mapalo's family's prayers. At the food distribution, Mapalo and dozens of others in rural Zambia received much-needed food, cleaning supplies, and COVID-19 education. PRIORITIES FOR 2021

- To reach 1,000 more orphaned and vulnerable 1. children through comprehensive custom plans.
- 2. Co-create custom plans for 19 on-going church partnerships, facilitate the graduating process for 40 church partners, and onboard 35 new church partners to begin the 5-year partnership process to serve more orphaned and vulnerable children.
- Increase family empowerment activities to support caregivers and families to be selfsufficient and recover from the challenges caused by COVID-19.
- Strengthening our programming approach by adapting evidence-based tools to improve program planning, delivery, evaluation and reporting.
- **5.** Continue to strengthen our organization, operational systems, networking/advocacy, and fundraising to improve program delivery and stability.
