A NOTE FROM OUR BOARD



Dear Friends,

On behalf of the Forgotten Voices Board of Directors, I would like to say thank you for your continued prayers and support.

In 2023, we had the privilege of partnering with local churches dedicated to empowering families and caregivers to meet the needs of orphaned and vulnerable children in their communities. Despite the challenges we face, I am constantly reminded that God's goodness is present even in our most difficult times.

Over the past year, our ministry has faced many challenges. We lost two crucial staff members: Remmy Hamapande, who served as the Zambia Country Director, and Sikhangezile Moyo, whom we fondly knew as "Skha." Their passing created a significant void in our programming. It was difficult for us to grieve and move forward with our work simultaneously. Remmy and Skha were passionate advocates for the orphaned and vulnerable, and they used their God-given talents to impact countless lives in their communities and beyond.

The situation for the children, families and communities we serve in southern Africa is challenging due to several factors, including extreme poverty, family breakdown, trauma, political and economic instability and other local conditions. These issues continue to significantly impact communities, putting the health and well-being of vulnerable children and families at risk.

Additionally, in the past year, inflation and an increase in the cost of living in the US have led to a decrease in the amount of donations received across all of our funding streams. Our Board and staff are actively working to improve engagement with donors and adjust our financial projections and program priorities accordingly. Yet, even during a year marked by loss and increasing hardships, His faithfulness carried us through. We believe there is a lot worth celebrating!

In this report, we are excited to share all God accomplished through Forgotten Voices in 2023. You'll hear how Forgotten Voices is collaborating locally and globally to improve the well-being of orphaned and vulnerable children and their families. We pray that you'll be inspired by the resiliency of those we serve and encouraged by stories that show how **you strengthen local churches, build strong families and help children thrive**.



HOW YOU MADE AN IMPACT

Despite many challenges, we are excited to celebrate the impact you made on **7,648 orphaned and vulnerable children** and **1,385 caregivers** in Zimbabwe, Zambia and Malawi! Through your faithful giving, we partnered with **56 local churches** to provide sustainable, Christ-centered programs that offer relief, support and hope for the most vulnerable children and families.

BUILDING STRONGER FAMILIES

Joyce and her husband live in a partially built, one-room shanty with 4 of their children and 8 grandchildren. Even in their old age, Joyce and her husband work hard to provide for the children, but cannot meet their family's needs. To keep their family together, they collect large river stones and use hammers to break them down into smaller gravel to sell, which is hard work.

Despite Joyce's tireless efforts to provide for her family, more was needed, and it seemed impossible to keep food on the table or her children in school.

Forgotten Voices' church partner in the community visited the family and brought basic food supplies to help them. Joyce was overwhelmed with emotion, saying, *"My mealie-meal bucket was actually empty. I did not know what I was going to feed the children tonight."*

Since that visit, and in less than a year of receiving support from her local church, Joyce has participated in life skills and parenting support seminars, undergone Christian discipleship training with One Hope and has been empowered to start and manage her own business! Furthermore, the children can attend school and have the necessary supplies to learn.



Today, Joyce shares, "Thank you so much. You have greatly helped me and my family. Words alone can never be enough to say thank you."

Joyce's family is one of many empowered to meet the needs of orphaned and vulnerable children. Thanks to your generous support, we can provide lasting solutions to **support caregivers and build stronger families so children can thrive!** With tears in her eyes, Lidia expressed, "Thank you so much for the love you have shown us." One act of kindness and a holistic, family-based approach to orphan care transformed Lidia's family.

In May, students from Messiah University's Economic Empowerment group traveled to Zambia with Forgotten Voices to cofacilitate Community Savings Group trainings with our local church partners.

The workshops helped 69 caregivers learn new financial skills to effectively meet the needs of orphaned and vulnerable children in their care.



We are grateful to have partnered with One Hope in Zimbabwe to distribute Christian discipleship materials and **train caregivers and church leaders** on how to best share the Word of God with children!

Empowering Families

In March, Malawi was struck by a tropical cyclone equivalent to a Category 5 hurricane. The storm destroyed homes, displaced over 500,000 people and compounded the vulnerabilities of orphaned children, families and communities.

In partnership with local churches, Forgotten Voices responded to the crisis through disaster relief efforts, traumainformed care and by providing income generating grants that empowered caregivers to rebuild their livelihoods.



"The church gave me money to renovate my house and start a business, so I purchased sugarcane to sell. The business went on successfully, such that **my four children can eat at the same time that our house is being renovated**. It is like a miracle! Helping Children Thrive

Our team joined hands with the Malawi Police and Ministry of Social Good to conduct community-based training workshops. These workshops equipped church leaders with knowledge and skills to protect children.

37 leaders and caregivers participated and were trained to identify and respond to cases of child abuse, establish local child protection policies and **create safe spaces for children.**

In 2023, leaders from more than **85 countries** learned about our vision, mision and model for orphan care.


